

## **COFFEE IN THE CAR PARK**

From the end of September and into October the three surgeries (Whiteley, Jubilee and Highlands) making up the Sovereign Primary Care Network have been giving "drive through" flu vaccinations to their most vulnerable patients, using the Hospital carpark at weekends, when the Hospital is closed. Time slots were sent to patients who were able to drive their cars through a prepared route round the car park, vaccinations being given as they thrust their arms out of the car window. In some rather wet weather, our Hospitality Group turned out to support the GP staff giving the flu jabs with tea, coffee and biscuits, and clearing a rest room for them in the Hospital.

This was much appreciated, and the Group have been asked to support them again when the next round of vaccinations takes place as more supplies of the vaccine become available.
