#### Letter from the Chair

Once again, I can report that The Friends continue to be very busy with the various groups such as Memory Group, Hospitality, Gardening and Transport. I would like to welcome all our new volunteers and thank them for answering the call, but I must add at this point that we are still in need of more volunteers in all these areas.

Petta and I were invited at the end of June to do a talk to Hillhead Residents Association centered around the work of the Friends and the Community Hospital. We had a very enjoyable evening and received some very good feedback. Many of the residents there were unaware of the different activities we are involved in.

I am very pleased to announce that the long-awaited Renal Unit opened its doors on Monday 14th August. They initially operated only 12 stations to give time for both patients and staff to familiarise themselves with the new facility. Elaine Gamm and I were fortunate to be given a guided preview tour of this lovely new facility which is state of the art. The official opening will be sometime in October.

## **Volunteer Gardening Group**

It's a time of change, Jill Sadler is relinquishing her role as lead of the gardening group. Jill was instrumental in creating the Gardening Group, which saw the management of the island in front of the hospital, the development of the inner courtyards, and the creation of the three large planters at the rear of the hospital gardens. Jill is taking a well-earned rest from the work of the committee and thanks go to both Jill and David, her husband who together have been the backbone of the gardening group among many other activities.

The Gardening Group lives on and Robert Cowan has agreed to be the gardening group team manager. It is intended, weather permitting, that the gardening group will meet at 0930hrs on the third Wednesday of each month. On Wednesday 18 October, seven team members worked hard on the island; removing all the weeds and dead plants; splitting and re positioning plants that had grown too large and preparing the ground for planting of new plants.

As well as managing the main island at the entrance to the hospital, the gardening team also maintain the three large planters donated by GB partnerships, and internal courtyard gardens.

The next gardening session is planned for Wednesday 15 November, 09:30-11:30 unless otherwise advised, when we will put in new plants, prepare the three large planters for winter and time permitting do a final check of the inner gardens.
